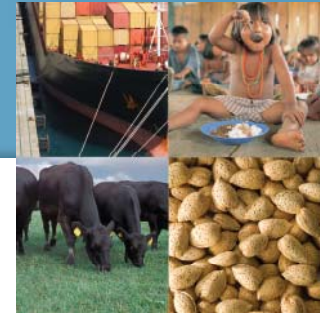

- **Fellows Since Inception in 2004:** 563 fellows from 64 countries
- **Partners & Mentors include:** U.S. universities, government agencies, international research centers, nonprofit institutions and private companies
- **FY2011:** 38 fellows from 23 countries
- **Fellowship Duration:** 6-12 weeks

- **Pest Risk Assessment Processes for Horticultural Products and Detection Methodology and Mitigation Measures for Food Borne Illnesses in Meat**
- **Developing and Applying Risk Assessment Methodology for GMOs and Interpreting Risk Assessment Data**
- **Development of Saline-Resistant Rice Varieties**



Training Priorities

Indonesia

- **Climate Change Agricultural Mitigation and Adaptation:**
 - genetic modification for rice, corn, or sorghum
 - agroforestry production system yield, minimal greenhouse gas emissions, carbon sequestration, and global climate change policy analysis and development
- **Aquaculture:**
 - control and prevent aquaculture diseases
 - genetic and breeding of aquaculture
- **Food Science and Technology:**
 - food safety (sanitary and phytosanitary, hazard analysis and critical control points, and cold chain)
 - nanotechnology in food products

Global Research Alliance

Global Research Alliance (GRA) Borlaug Fellowships

- **GRA is a collaborative international research effort announced at the Climate Change talks in Copenhagen in December 2009**
- **Currently, 14 eligible countries in the Global Research Alliance on Agricultural Greenhouse Gases including Indonesia, Vietnam, Malaysia, Philippines, India and Pakistan in Asia. Seven fellows were selected this year world-wide.**
- **Target Research: Greenhouse Gas and Carbon Sequestration assessments & databases, Mitigating Greenhouse Gas Emissions in Crop and Grazing Systems**



2010 Borlaug GRA Fellow, Tran Thi Le Ha

Ms. Thi Le Ha's Borlaug GRA Fellowship studied methane emission in paddy fields, seeking to reduce paddy fields' contribution to global warming, and increase rice production in her native Vietnam.

The Norman E. Borlaug International Agricultural Science and Technology Fellows Program (Borlaug Fellowship Program) helps developing countries strengthen sustainable agricultural practices by providing scientific training and collaborative research opportunities to visiting researchers, policymakers, and university faculty. The program matches participants from developing countries with experts in their field at land-grant universities, government agencies, and international research centers.

The Borlaug Fellowship Program has grown from 33 fellows from five countries in its first year in 2004, to a total of 358 fellows from 49 countries in 2008.
